MEMBERSHIP GUIDE / INFORMATION SHEET

Dear Applicant:

We appreciate your interest in the Vancouver Japanese Language School & Japanese Hall (VJLS-JH). This application has information and supplemental documents to support your understanding of who we are as an organization, your rights and obligations as a member, and the process of application.

GENERAL BACKGROUND:

VJLS-JH is structured using a governance model that is fully compliant with the Societies Act of British Columbia. Under this model, strategic oversight is managed by the Board of Directors with operations delegated to staff under the direction of the Executive Director. For a visual representation of how this works, please review the governance chart here.

In implementing this structure, VJLS-JH transitioned its membership model from one where membership was required to receive services to one where membership is entirely optional and opt-in. This change was made in recognition that there is a difference between being a student/participant in a program/class and being a member of the society with an interest in the overall governance of the organization, its constitution, its mission, and its fiduciary concerns.

CURRENT MEMBERSHIP & FEES:

The membership term begins at the conclusion of the Annual General Meeting (AGM) and run until the conclusion of the following AGM. The AGM is typically held in late November or early December of each year. Notice will be publicly posted on the VJLS-JH website and social media.

The current membership fee is \$20.

- 4) To assist interested persons or groups in encouraging all of the above;
- 5) To pursue any other objective that may be incidental to any of the above.
